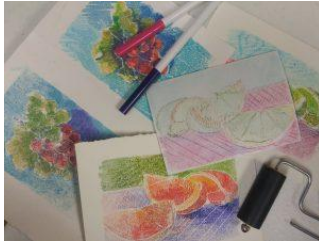

Session I: Printing making is an ancient technique. Christy MacMorran will show how it can be done with modern supplies on Thursday, February 13. Christy was an award-winning artist at Art in the Park and teaches classes in various mediums.



Session II: Paulette Todd, artist and teacher, will teach painting with pastels on February 20. Paulette recently retired from teaching for 19 years at her business, Kids Art Club. She sells her artwork at Warehouse 300 in Trenton, IL and has organized the Kids Kreations Area for Art in the Park for many years. She was recently recognized by Mathis, Marifian and Richter Law Firm for her "Winter Bluejay" artwork, winning her an award of \$500 as well as \$500 donated to Highland Art Council.



Session III: Rebecca Eaton will help you create a pocket scarf with chunky yarn in a variety of colors on February 27. Rebecca earned her Bachelor degree from Greenville College and works with Hard Road Theater and the Highland High School Madrigals as a costume designer. She is also on faculty for Highland Arts Center, teaching master classes and private lessons of weaving and sewing.

Session IV: On March 6, Sarah Walker will teach papermaking. Sarah is a professional artist from Highland. She serves on the Highland Arts Council and is a Master of Fine Arts degree from SIUE. Sarah also teaches for the Macoupin County Arts Center in Staunton, IL.

Session V: Percussion and visual arts await you on March 13, Courtney Sellers will teach a visual arts project and David Williams, a retired band and choir teacher, composer, and conductor and a teacher from Highland Arts Center, will lead a drum circle where everyone will play a hand-held drum. Courtney is an art instructor at the Highland Community School District at the Middle School.
